This year featured a \$1.00 price increase for the adult meal, but that increase allowed guests an all you can eat meal. 1,568 meals were served, approximately 40 less than last year. However, the overall income was \$12,797.33, an increase of more than \$1,500.00 from 2017. The increase in revenue was due, in part, to remaining buckets of soup and chili, which allowed many to purchase for home. These buckets sold out in about a week. The Chili & Chicken Noodle Soup Day committee chairs would like to thank the many student-workers from our grade school as well as PSR and FFA students. Worker coverage during the peak hours was excellent, and the adult workers did a great job in leading. Thanks to everyone who volunteered, or joined us for great food and drink. See you next year!
