## FRESH FROM THE MIND OF FR. ANDY

oThe baptism of Jesus is on His part the acceptance and inauguration of His mission as God's suffering Servant. He allows Himself to be numbered among sinners; He is already the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. o Already He is anticipating the baptism of His bloody death. Already He is coming to fulfill all righteousness, o that is, He is submitting Himself entirely to His Father's will: out of love He consents to this baptism of death for the remission of our sins. The Father's voice responds to the Son's acceptance, proclaiming His entire delight in His Son. The Spirit whom Jesus possessed in fullness from His conception comes to rest on Him. o Jesus will be the source of the Spirit for all mankind. At His baptism the heavens were opened o the heavens that Adam's sin had closed o and the waters were sanctified by the descent of Jesus and the Spirit, a prelude to the new creation o (Catechism of the Catholic Church, Number 536).

Two weeks ago in this space I shared Numbers 1 & 2 of Pope Francis' World Day of Peace Letter 2019 to the People of God on Good Politics at the Service of Peace. Here's Number 7, His Holiness' concluding remarks. oIn these days, we celebrate the seventieth anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, adopted in the wake of the Second World War. In this context, let us also remember the observation of Saint Pope John XXIII: Man's awareness of his rights must inevitably lead him to the recognition of his duties. His possession of rights involves the duty of implementing those rights, for they are the expression of a man's personal dignity. And the possession of rights also involves their recognition and respect by others. o Peace, in effect, is the fruit of a great political project grounded in the mutual responsibility and interdependence of human beings. But it is also a challenge that demands to be taken up ever anew. It entails a conversion of heart and soul; it is both interior and communal; and it has three inseparable aspects: a) peace with oneself, rejecting inflexibility, anger and impatience; in the words of Saint Francis de Sales, showing a bit of sweetness towards oneself in order to offer a bit of sweetness to others; b) peace with others: family members, friends, strangers, the poor and the suffering, being unafraid to encounter them and listen to what they have to say; and c) peace with all creation, rediscovering the grandeur of God's gift and our individual and shared responsibility as inhabitants of this world, citizens and builders of the future. The politics of peace, conscious of and deeply concerned for every situation of human vulnerability, can always draw inspiration from the *Magnificat*, the hymn that Mary, the Mother of Christ the Saviour and Queen of Peace, sang in the name of all mankind: He has mercy on those who fear Him in every generation. He has shown the strength of His arm; He has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly; i for He has remembered His promise of mercy, the promise He made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever (Luke 1:50-55). o
