FRESH FROM THE MIND OF FR. ANDY

For months, the poster on St. Ann Catholic School's front door has made countless persons aware that our elementary institution is "home to a LifeChanger nominee". Formal mention of her nomination was published in two November issues of The St. Ann Standard. In case you missed reading all about it or forgot what you read (due to the passage of time), The Nashville News provides us with a refresher article: "St. Ann Catholic School eighth grade teacher Janice Gaubatz has been nominated for the 2018-2019 National LifeChanger of the Year award. Gaubatz was recognized as a LifeChanger in her community for her devotion to making a difference in her students' lives. Last year, Gaubatz oversaw the Works of Mercy program to help her school serve those in the community. The students led donation efforts for shoes to create clean water in Africa, provided clothing and necessities for those imprisoned at a local jail, and carried out other projects that led to St. Ann receiving the Belleville Diocese's Sr. Leona Luechtefeld Award for service. Gaubatz was nominated by her principal, Pierre Antoine. "There are thousands and thousands of teachers throughout this world who care and are marvelous at their craft. Mrs. Gaubatz is one of the many teachers whose goal is to mold students into servant leaders," said Antoine. "I can tell you she is doing just that, every day." Sponsored by the National Life Group Foundation, LifeChanger of the Year recognizes and rewards the very best K-12 educators and school district employees across the United States who are making a difference in the lives of students by exemplifying excellence, positive influence, and leadership. Each school year, LifeChanger of the Year receives hundreds of nominations from all 50 states and the District of Columbia. Seventeen individual LifeChanger of the Year awards will be given during the 2018-2019 school year....Winners are announced via surprise award ceremonies held at their schools. The grand prize finalists will also be honored at a national awards ceremony in April 2019 in Hawaii, where the Grand Prize Winner will be revealed. Winners are chosen by a selection committee comprised of former winners and education professionals. Nominees must be K-12 teachers or school district employees. To be considered for an award, nominees must make a positive impact in the lives of students, enhance their school or district's atmosphere, culture and pride, demonstrate exemplary leadership at the school and/or district level, possess a proven record of professional excellence, show commitment to building a nurturing environment that supports learning, and adhere to the highest moral and ethical standards" (Wednesday, January 23, 2019, Volume 85, Number 31, Page 16).
