Respect Life Corner – Pentecost: Feast of Unity, Understanding, and Sharing

“On that morning, fifty days after Easter, a powerful wind blew over Jerusalem and the flame of the Holy Spirit descended on the gathered disciples. It came to rest upon the head of each of them and ignited in them a divine fire, a fire of love, capable of transforming things. Their fear disappeared, their hearts were filled with new strength, their tongues were loosened and they began to speak freely, in such a way that everyone could understand the news that Jesus Christ had died and was risen. On Pentecost, where there was division and incomprehension, unity and understanding were born” (Pope Benedict XVI, Pentecost 2012). *Learn, Act, Connect, Pray*: Call upon the power of the Holy Spirit to empower us to spread unity in a divided and intolerant world and to share our resources with those who have not. *Holy Spirit, may we respect all life because You, God, are the Source of Life.*
